1. Easter Toilet Roll Chick:

Materials Needed: _____

1 Cardboard paper towel roll.

Yellow Paint/or Yellow Felt tip Pen

Orange Card

Pens

Feathers (preferably yellow or white)

Scissors

Glue



Firstly, paint or colour your paper towel roll tube yellow. Then put to one side and cut out 1 triangle from the orange card for the beak and 2 rounded shapes for the chick's feet. If you don't have any orange card, you can just colour in white paper with an orange felt tip or crayons. Once the tube has dried, draw on 2 eyes and glue on the beak. Next glue 2 feathers to the back of the tube to create the chick's wings. You can also add feathers to the top rim of the tube to make its hair. To finish off, fold up the back of the feet shapes to create 2 tabs. Then add glue or tape to secure them on the inside of the tube so the chick's feet stick out. You should now have a fluffy Easter chick! Enjoy!

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2. Tin Foil Easter Egg: _____

Materials needed:

Cardboard

Scissors

Tin Foil

Sharpies or Felt tip pens.



First draw an egg shape on your cardboard and cut out. A4 size is best. Next lay your cardboard egg on top of a sheet of tin foil and fold over the edges so the front is completely covered. Make sure to fold over any of the foil's sharp edges or cover them with masking tape. Leaving the lid of the marker pens on, mark out designs onto the front of your egg. Next trace over your marks and lines with the marker pens, adding any additional details you would like. Marking out the design first isn't necessary but it does give the egg more texture and tracing is good hand-eye coordination practice. When finished you will have a shiny coloured tin foil Easter egg!

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
