

3. Easter Bunny Hat: _____

Materials Needed:

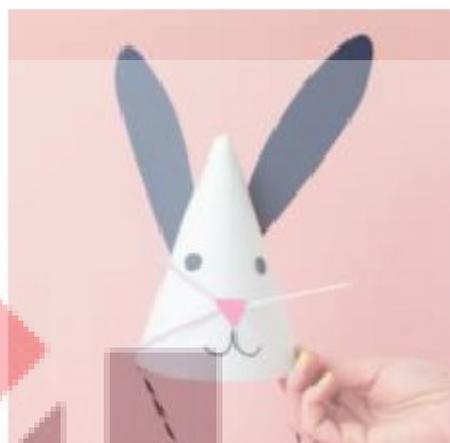
Coloured Card Stock

Pens

Glue

Craft Twine or Elastic Cord

Hole punch/Scissors



Start out using the hat template to make your cone hat shape. Next cut out bunny ear shapes, 2 skinny strips for the whiskers, a triangle for the nose and circles for the eyes. Use glue to attach these to your cone hat. Play around with using different colours and shapes. Next draw on a mouth and any other details you like. Now make 2 holes on the 2 sides of the cone and thread through the craft twine or elastic cord. Create 2 knots on the inside so the thread is secured in a loop. Next try on the hat and adjust the cord if necessary to make sure it stays on the head when worn. Once finished you will have a functioning bunny party hat! Try experimenting with different Easter animals such as a fluffy chick or woolly lamb using different coloured card and other materials.

4. Yarn Squiggle Easter Egg

Materials:

String, Twine or Yarn

Card

Pen

PVA glue on a plate

Watercolours/Acrylics/Crayons



Use the Easter egg template to cut out an egg shape from a piece of card. Next mix some PVA glue with a little water and pour onto a plate. Now take the first piece of string/yarn/twine and dip it into the glue, and move it within the glue to make sure all of it is covered. You can use a paintbrush if necessary to add glue to any uncovered sections. Once covered with the glue, dangle the string above your egg shape and gently lower it creating squiggles, loops and lines as you go. Continue doing this until all the white space is filled. Now let to dry fully before starting to paint. Once dried, use watercolours, paints, crayons or felt tip pen to fill in the spaces created by the yarn. Try experimenting making new colours like purples and greens! Continue filling in the blank spaces until the egg is completely coloured in.
