## Activity

Hide a set of interesting objects (e.g. pretend jewels) around Westbere Copse, then take the children on a hunt to find them. After a set amount of time, meet back together to talk about the 'treasure'.

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Questions could include: How might you count your jewels? How many jewels have you found?

### Resources

Nets, buckets, jewels, coins, magnifying glasses, binoculars, tweezers, Ipads.
