



<p>30 minutes</p> <p>Times tables practice</p> <p>Select one or more of the activities below to practice your times tables.</p> <p>Activity 1: Use the Hit the Button app or complete a times tables grid as attached below.</p> <p>Activity 2: Throw two dice and ask the children to write down the multiplication. If you want to work on tables higher than one to six, use small stickers to change the numbers.</p> <p>Activity 3: How quickly can you complete the times table grids? Blank times tables grid</p>	<p>30 minutes</p> <p>Reading with an adult</p> <p>Read two or three books to your child. After each book, chat about your favourite parts of the book.</p> <p>Invite Your Child to “Read”. Look at a book with your child. Practice looking for tricky words.</p> <p>Make sure you look at the comprehension tips on the school website.</p>	<p>30 minutes</p> <p>WALT: Revise the phase 5 phonics sounds.</p> <p>Phonics</p> <p>Firstly, practice spelling these words by using the method of ‘read, cover and check’: little, one, do, when, what, out.</p> <p>Now play the board game below with your child, practicing the different phase 5 phonics sounds.</p> <p>You will need a dice for this game.</p> <p>Board game</p> <p>Extension: Revise the alternative spelling patterns for ‘ea’ with Mr Thorne.</p> <p>Ask your child to read the phoneme spotter story ‘Real Treat’.</p>	<p>30 minutes</p> <p>Grammar</p> <p>WALT: Practice our spelling, grammar and punctuation skills.</p> <p>Ask your child to complete the spelling, grammar and punctuation activity sheet below.</p> <p>Spelling, grammar and punctuation sheet</p>	<p>30 minutes</p> <p>Independent reading</p> <p>Encourage your child to read independently for 30 minutes.</p> <p>Ensure that they have got a comfortable space and have chosen a book of an appropriate level for independent reading.</p>

<p>45 minutes</p> <p>Maths Number</p> <p>WALT: Revise column addition.</p> <p>Begin by playing some mental arithmetic games with your child, asking them to add up two numbers. For example: 40 plus 7 17 plus 5 24 plus 10 15 plus 11 24 plus 32</p> <p>Work progressively so that the sums rely on more challenging mental calculations.</p> <p>Ask your child to complete the following activity/ activities, selecting the appropriate task for your child.</p> <p>Level 1 sheet</p> <p>Level 2 sheet</p>	<p>45 minutes</p> <p>Comprehension</p> <p>WALT: Ask and answer questions about the topic of Plants.</p> <p>Key questions to ask your child: What do plants grow from?
