This is a lovely activity to talk about feelings with your child.

All you need is a jar and some paper.

Adult's, maybe you can model a worry for your child and put the paper in the jar.

Pin the tail on the donkey

You need to pay attention to the objects he has in his mouth and around him.

It could be helpful to stop and start the story so they can really look at the pictures in the story.

When you have finished your list you can draw a picture of some of the objects you found in the story.



- 5 raw white eggs
- 5 cups

Now we have everything ready here's what to do:

- Label the cups with the name of each drink you have poured inside. Don't forget the water cup!
- When your cups are ready put one egg inside each cup.
- Check your eggs after a few hours.

We need to go outside for this activity, bringing with us our pot of water and paint brush.

If you do not have garden space, you can use a chalk board.

formation lesson we are going to prepare for our lesson by stretching out our shoulders with something called 'I don't know'.

When we say 'I don't know' we normally move our shoulders up and down.

This is what we are going to do.

Start with your arms down by your sides and then bend the elbows 90 degrees with palms facing upwards.

Then lift the shoulders up towards the ears hold for 2 seconds or say slowly "I don't know!" then release the shoulders.

Repeat 5 times.

Excellent! Now let's start the lesson with 'p'.

Recycling count and colour

Our morning maths activity is called recycling count and colour.

In our focus book we saw the magpie recycling different objects.

Today we are going to count and colour the objects that can be recycled. When you have counted them and coloured them in, circle the correct number that represents the amount.





Recycling information

Let's learn more about recycling just like the messy magpie had to!

Did you know when you throw away an empty drink carton or food packaging, do you think carefully about whether or not it can be recycled?

It wasn't so long ago that people took their recycling to a special facility by themselves.



Today for our drama activity we are going to create a bakery!

The children can create their own bakery with baked goods and sell them to their friends and family who would be their customers.

You can make goodies, like cookies and cakes, using cardboard paper cut outs and crayons.

If you have any cooking magazines with different baked goods they can cut them out and use them too!


You will need:



Encourage your child to write or draw an emotion that they are feeling on each day.






