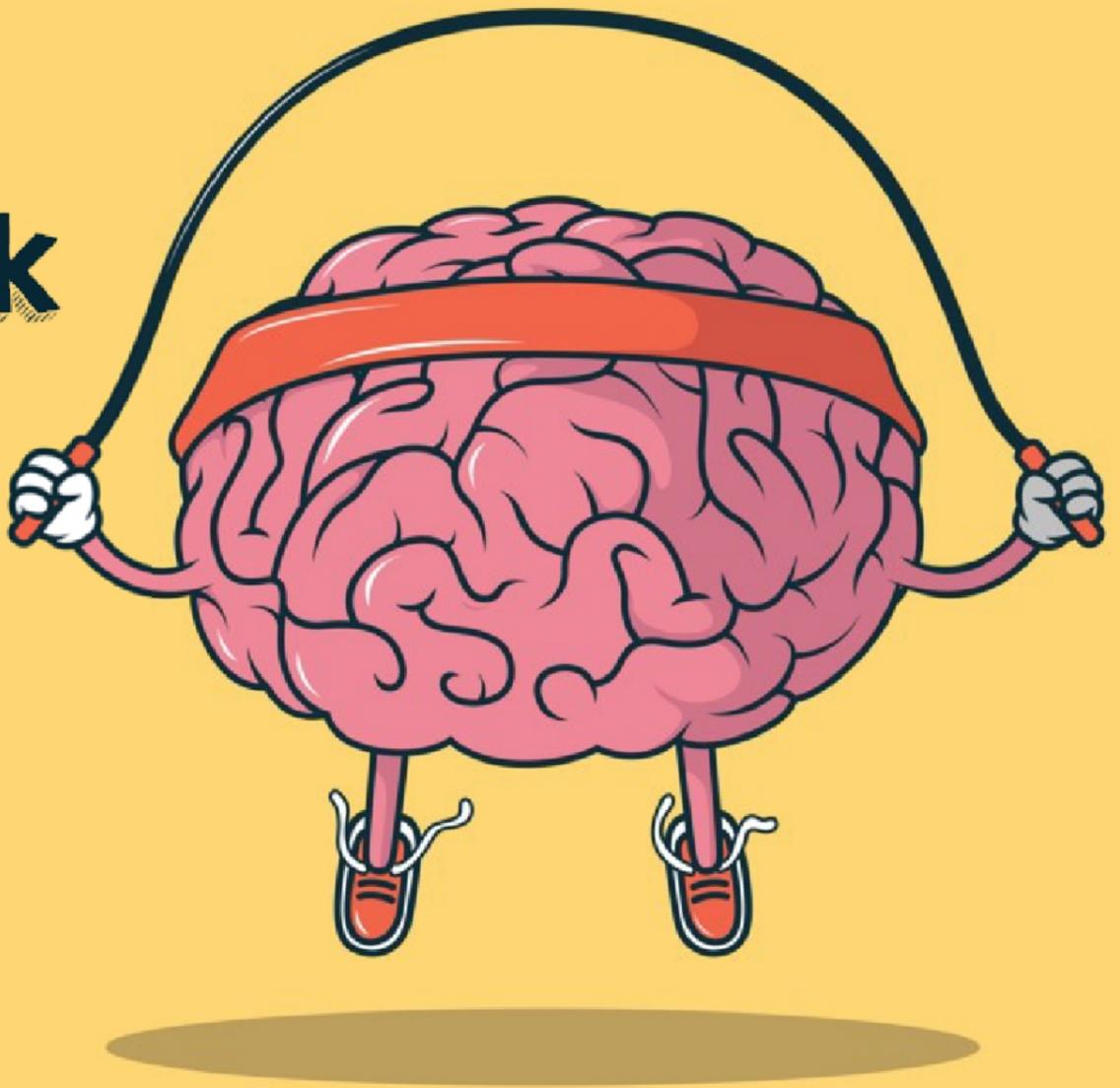

#### Literacy

This week in Creative Writing, the children will continue to read the class book 'James and the Giant Peach' and will be introduced to diary writing. The children will identify the features of writing a diary entry and will compose their own diary entry based on James' experience of discovering the creatures inside the peach. The children will step into this character's shoes and use their imagination to write from his point of view. At home, the children can practice creating their own diary entry about something interesting they did over the weekend, remembering to use time connectives and adjectives to describe their feelings.

#### Maths

This week in Maths, the children will be introduced to ordinal numbers. They will listen to the story of 'Henry the Fourth' and learn how to recognise ordinal numbers and their written representation. The children will also participate in a range of matching and race activities to help them think practically about ordinal numbers and help them represent these in their daily lives. At home, the children can ask each family member what date their birthday is on and order the ordinal dates from the start to the end of the year. The children can also take part in race games and think about who came 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>.

#### Project

This week in Project, the children will be learning about what the climate crisis is. They will be looking into the life of Greta Thunberg and the role she played as an activist, fighting for change. The children will delve into activism, understand what it is, and give examples of what they do. They will then have the opportunity to discuss what we can do to make good choices to preserve our environment. At home, the children can create a poster of what they can do, as an individual, to preserve our environment.

#### Science

This week in Science, the children will continue to build on their learning from last week. They will learn that the Earth orbits the sun once a year and that the Moon takes approximately 28 days to orbit the Earth. The pupils will create a poster explaining the relationship between the Earth, Sun and Moon, by focusing on the key concepts; orbit, characteristics, spin and axis. Please reinforce these concepts at home.
