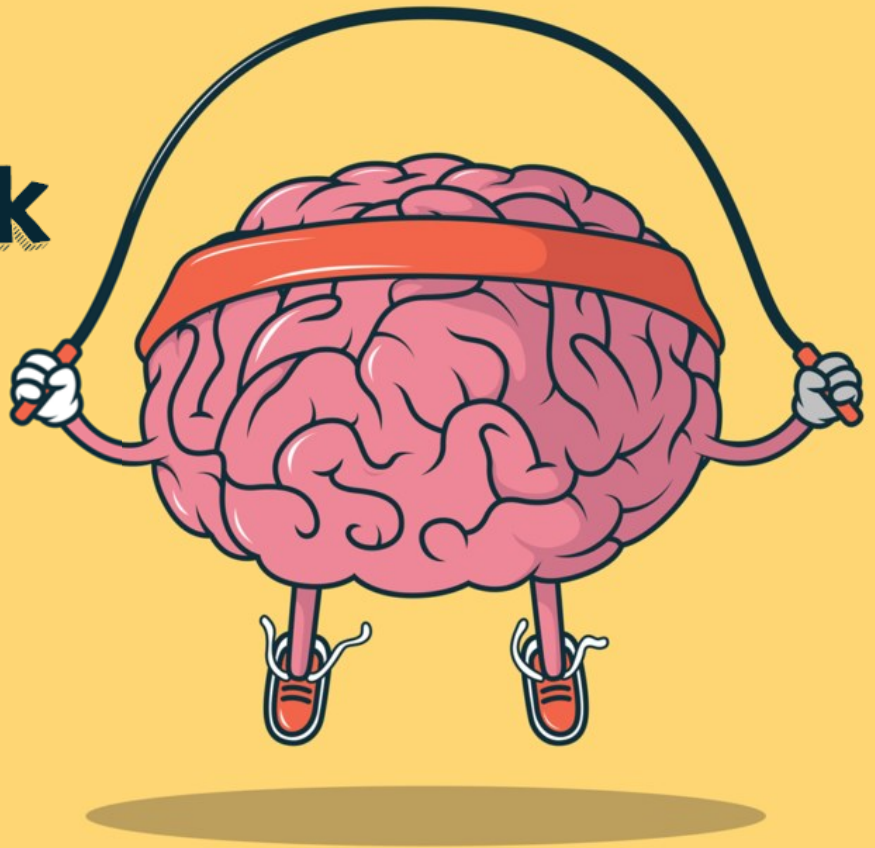

This week we are learning to...



Literacy

This week our two new focus sounds in Phonics are the letters 'c' and 'k', we will recall the letter rhymes 'curl around the caterpillar' and 'down the kangaroo's body, tail and leg' to remember the correct starting point and direction of our letters. We will practise tracing the letters before having a go at forming them independently. We will then create our own illustration of something that begins with these two letters to represent our new sounds. As a group, we will have a go at sounding out and blending to spell and read three and four letter words beginning with c and k. At home, you can use your cooking skills to make your own sound biscuits to enjoy! Alternatively, you could help out with preparing dinner and using the ingredients you could spell out words beginning with c and k. For example, using dried pasta to spell 'cat' and 'King' before cooking the pasta.

Understanding the World

This week the children will be exploring the five senses sight, smell, listening, touch and taste. The children will be using their senses to explore objects around the room and try to identify these. At home this week, you can use your five senses to write down something you can hear, see, smell, touch and taste.

Maths

In our Maths number lesson this week we are learning about the concept of ordering numbers from zero to ten, and showcasing understanding of using the language 'first, next, after, before.' Understanding that we start with the smallest number and that our numbers then get bigger. Using our number formation rhymes, we will form the numbers zero to ten and match them with the correct objects and be able to create our own number line placing the numbers in the correct order. We will continue to master the use of Numicon understanding what number each Numicon represents. At home, you can create your own number line using paper, pencils or pens. You can then create holes in your paper to then connect each number together using string to enable you to put your numbers in the correct order, starting with the smallest number, finishing with the largest number.
