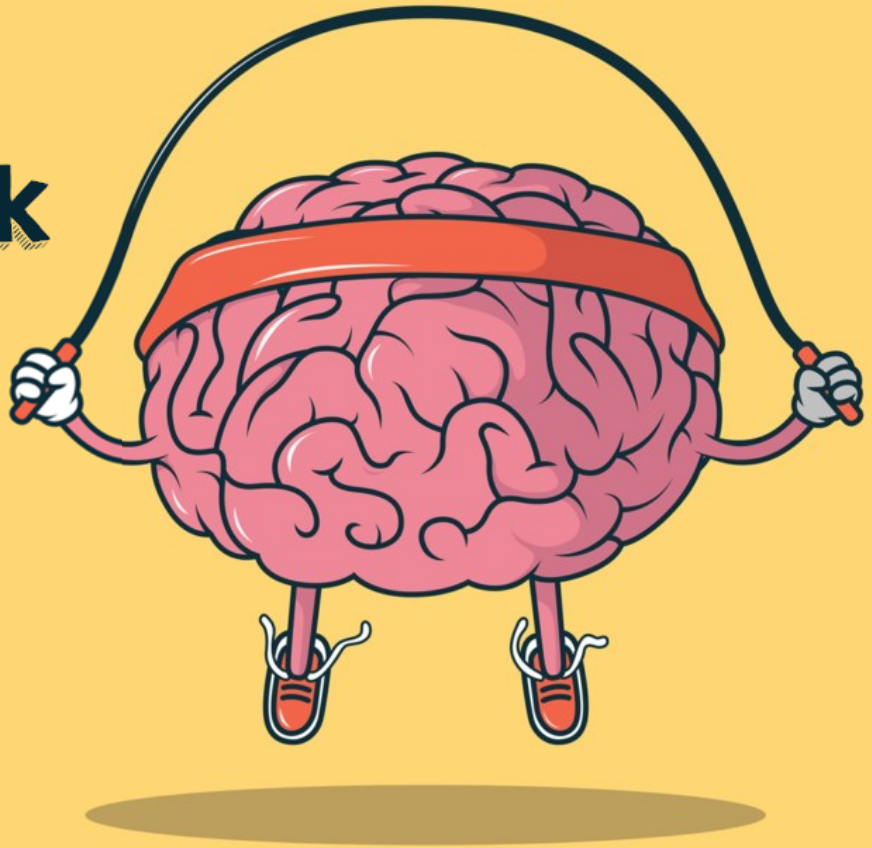

**This week
we are
learning
to...**



Literacy:

This week in our Creative Writing lessons, the children will be exploring the wonderful work of Dr Seuss. The children will look at rhyming words and will use the superpowers of the Creative Camel to create their own nonsense words within their own text. At home, encourage your child to match rhyming words and to highlight rhyming words they hear when reading. In Phonics, the children will look at the 'qu' sound and are encouraged to utilise the activities and online library provided on Reading Eggs and Reading Eggspress.

Maths:

This week in our Maths Number lesson, the children will be learning to use Numicon to represent a number. The children will be adding Numicon to their 'Big Thinking Toolbox' and will be solving simple addition and subtraction problems using this resource. At home, encourage your child to solve simple problems and ask to use their metacognitive skills to plan the task and to choose appropriate strategies to support them. In Maths Project, the children will be learning to program BeeBots using positional language. You can also encourage your child to wear their white thinking hats and plan their journey from home to school using appropriate directional language.

Science:

This week in our Science lesson, the children will learn and use the following key vocabulary in our Sustainability topic: plant-based diet, save energy, save the rainforest, refuse, reduce and reuse, recycle. At home, encourage your child to come up with a plan they would like to action that can potentially save the world from Global Warming.

Project:

This week in our Project lesson, the children will understand and explain why Archimedes is famous. At home, encourage your child to create a poster explaining key facts about the famous people covered so far this term.

Metacognition/Philosophy:

This week, the children be thinking about life without stories. They will discuss the importance of stories and will question how stories have influenced the world they live in.
