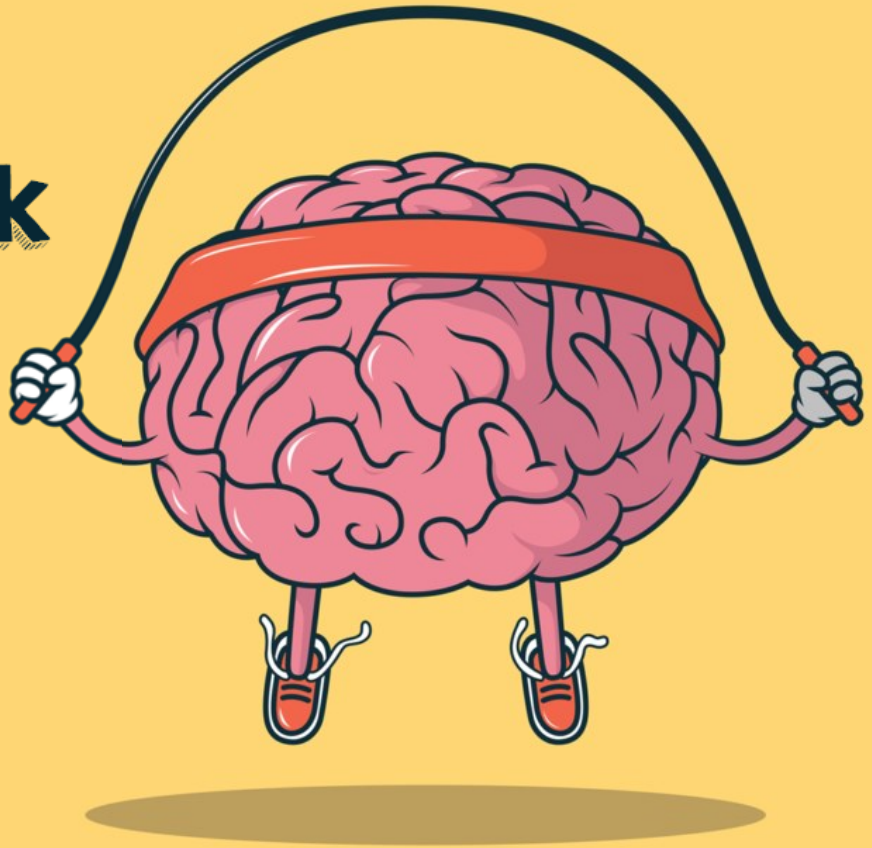

This week we are learning to...



Literacy

This week in our Creative Writing lesson, the children will be exploring the book, 'Winnie the Witch' by Valerie Thomas. They will be searching for examples of alliteration and adjectives in the text and will create a describing thinking frame to describe one of their favourite characters from the book. At home, you can encourage your child to choose a character from their favourite book and create a describing frame to practise using different adjectives. In Phonics, the children will continue looking at rhyming words and will further practise blending CVC sounds.

Maths

This week in our Maths Number lesson, the children will continue to explore partitioning numbers into hundreds, tens and ones. They will then use their new knowledge to solve addition problems with numbers up to 30. In our Maths Project lesson, the children will be adding different coins together to make new amounts. At home, you can set up an imaginary shop and use real coins to purchase items. Children are also challenged to use real coins to buy things outside and to send in photos of them doing so.

Science

This week in our Science lesson, the children will learn to identify the causes of climate change and recall facts to help them design an action plan. At home, encourage your child to go out to their local park and complete a litter pick activity, then get them to complete a checklist of things that they found that is a potential harm to the environment.

Project

This week in our Project lesson, the children will understand and explain why Empress Wu Zetian is famous. At home, encourage your child to recount why Empress Wu Zetian is famous, using the internet to continue with their research.

Metacognition/Philosophy

This week in a Metacognition lesson, the children will be looking at evaluating their own work. At home, encourage your child to wear their yellow and purple thinking hats to reflect on their strengths and areas to work on. They can then share their goals in class.
