Literacy

In our writing lessons this week, children will reflect on their weekend and apostrophes of contraction in their writing. We will understand that in a contraction, an apostrophe represents missing letters. For instance: 'He would' becomes 'He'd' and 'I have' becomes 'I've'. At home, encourage your child to use apostrophes for contraction in their own writing, for instance, when writing their weekly spelling sentences.

Maths

In Maths this week, the children will be studying how to solve complex word problems involving both addition and subtraction. We will be employing the RUCSAC method. R- Read the question, U- Underline the key fact, C- Choose the correct method or operation, S- Solve the problem, A - Answer the question, C - Check the answer. At home, why not try encouraging your child to write their own word problems to solve, encouraging them to use the RUCSAC method when solving them.

Science

In Science this week, the children will explore sustainability. We will learn how waste impacts our environment. We will understand the meaning of waste. The children will also then identify ways people manage and protect resources and reduce waste. We will make suggestions for how we can become more sustainable in the future. At home, why not encourage your child to be in charge of recycling and encourage family members to recycle.
