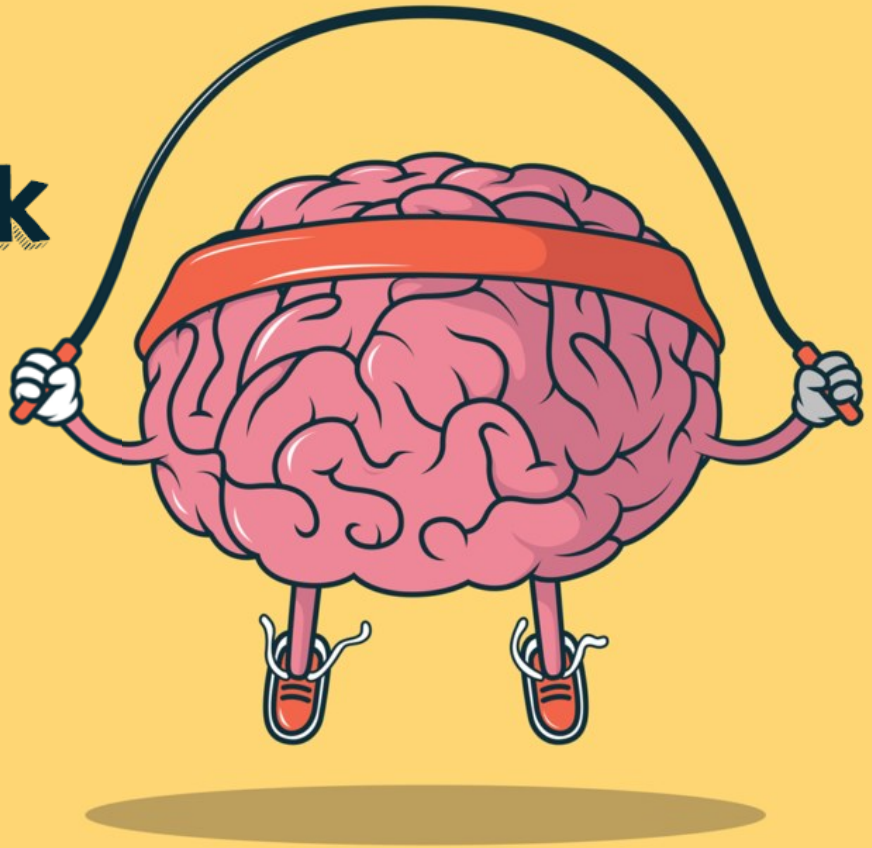

Literacy

This week in our Creative Writing lesson, the children will be wearing their green thinking hats and writing a report about a 'classroom break in.' The children will identify features of a newspaper report and will use adjectives to make their work more interesting for the reader. At home, you can create your own report about something the children have seen in the news. In Phonics, the children will be looking at the /sh/ sound and are encouraged to write a list of different words starting with this sound.

Maths

This week in our Maths Number lesson, the children will develop their problem solving and reasoning skills through a selection of worded addition problems. They will be looking in their 'thinking toolbox' to select the resources they would like to use and will use their metacognitive skills to plan, monitor and evaluate their ability in solving the addition problems. At home, you can give your child simple worded problems to solve. In Maths Project, the children will continue to work with coins and will be calculating change. At home, continue to practise using coins through role play.

Science

This week in our Science lesson, the children will continue to understand the impact caused by Green House Gases, where they will look into the process of how gases get trapped inside the earth's atmosphere. At home, encourage your child to continue their learning by researching the positives and negatives of Green House Gases.

Project

This week in our Project lesson, the children will understand and explain why Mary Read and Anne Bonny were significant figures. At home, encourage your child to continue their research by recounting whether Mary Read and Anne Bonny were famous or non-famous.
